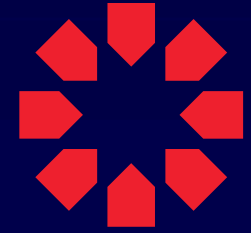

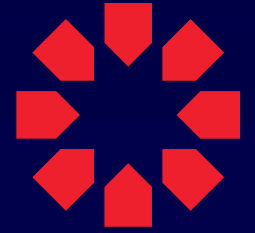


Marriage revokes your existing Will.

The moment you marry, your previous Will becomes void, regardless of how recently it was written. Sign a new one on the same day. Do not wait.

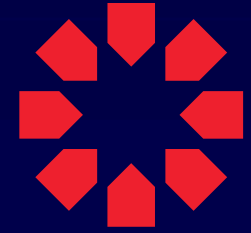


A photocopy is not a Will.

If you cannot produce the original wet-signed document, you do not have a legally valid Will. A scan, photo, or copy has no standing in law.

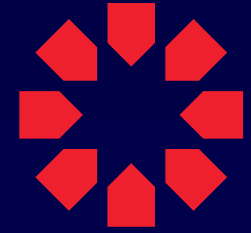


Off-the-shelf Wills aren't built for you.

Shareholdings, succession, family trusts, these need a solicitor who understands the complexity of your estate, not a generic template.

Review your Will every 2–3 years.

Or whenever something significant changes. Don't wait for circumstances to force your hand.

- Marriage or divorce
- Sale of the business
- A material change in your estate
- Birth of a child or grandchild
